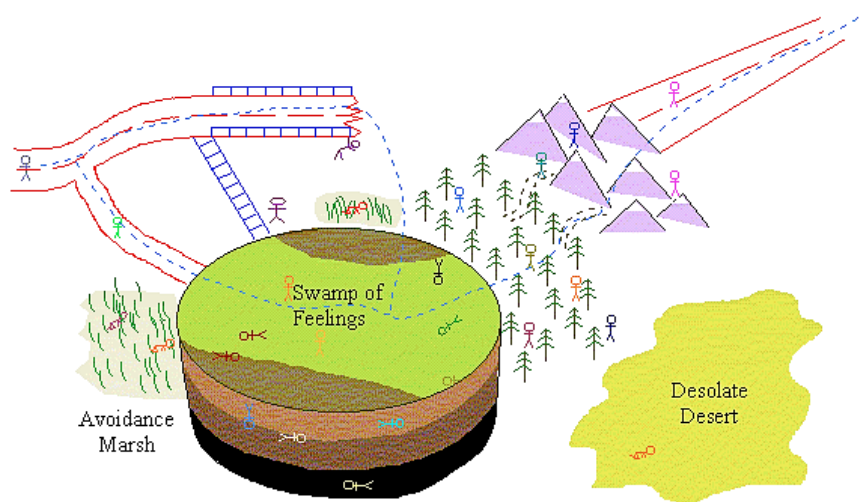
About the “Map of Loss”

The “Map of Loss” was developed in 1999 by Roslyn Snyder, published in *Journey to the centre of your life-The Map*. While appearing simple and easy to understand, the “Map of Loss” is a powerful tool, which has been used in self-care, clinical practice and community development to name a few. The “Map of Loss” has been the subject of a psychology Doctoral Thesis and full evaluations.

The Workshops

Day 1 & 2- The only way to understand the “Map of Loss” is to experience it. Therefore, in the first two days you are taken through the emotional landscape, exploring what it is like in each place. You slowly absorb the “Map” which allows you to understand what happens to you each day, to predict treatment options, empower individuals or community members. Each part of the “Map” has an activity (art, music, song or poetry) to ensure you retain what you learn.

Day 3- Looks at connections between the ‘Map of Loss’ and traditional Aboriginal culture and applications.
